

Cost of Living

Helping you at this difficult time

We know how difficult it is for a lot of people at the moment, so we've been working to set up support for those who need it. This involves working with our partner housing associations in the Borders and with charities like Cyrenians and Changeworks on various projects to help with energy advice, fuel debt payments, vouchers and more.

Overall, we've brought more than £0.5m to the Borders to help more than 4,000 tenants with fuel debt and vouchers. We also helped secure around £1m for tenants in benefits and grants through our Tenancy Sustainment Officers in 2022/23.

We will continue to make the case for more funding for the Borders so that we can continue to offer this vital cost of living support.

Get Help with Energy Costs

If you're struggling with energy costs, have built up debt or are struggling to deal with your supplier, we can help.

We have secured funding from the Scottish Government to assist tenants who have built up fuel debt. We also have a supply of pre-payment vouchers to help those who are struggling to keep their meter in credit.

Changeworks Partnerships



As part of our ongoing partnership with Changeworks, we are working on two new projects.

Air Source Heat Pump support - This support is offered to help learn how to use this new net zero carbon technology.

Support with your utilities - This is another support option if you need help to set up accounts, learn about your heating system, and deal with any supplier issues.

Domestic CCTV

Can I install a CCTV camera on my Eildon home?

If you want to install CCTV (including a video doorbell) at your home, you must first ask permission by using the <u>Alterations Request Form</u> available on our website <u>www.eildon.org.uk.</u>



If we give permission, it will be on the condition that you comply with the UK General Data Protection Regulations and the Data Protection Act (2018). The Information Commissioners Office provides useful information and guidance on the use of domestic CCTV systems, the potential repercussions of not respecting the privacy of others, and also the rights of those being filmed by domestic CCTV systems - Domestic CCTV systems - ICO. You'll find a leaflet on our website which gives further advice.





Our Community FoodHub

Our community foodhub was set up to make sure the most vulnerable people, and pets, across the Scottish Borders have access to essential food and household items.

With help from Scottish Borders Council, we have brought almost 90 tonnes of food down from Cyrenians FareShare in Leith over the last two years. Our Food Hub collects and then distributes surplus food (including pet food) to food banks, larders and pantries across the Borders.
